## Naknek, Alaska

The five-member Board of Education of the Bristol Bay Borough School District is conducting a search for a Superintendent. The School District is located in Southwestern Alaska at the head of Kvichak Bay, an arm of the larger Bristol Bay. The district is positioned in one of Alaska's most breathtaking regions and serves 98 students. The Board is seeking a candidate dedicated to providing an education that maintains

high academic proficiency, engages students, and prepares them well for any post-secondary educational or career opportunity.

The Board is offering an annual salary in the range of \$120,000-\$145,000 DOE. In addition, a district employee health insurance benefits package is provided. The Board offers professional membership dues, a life insurance stipend, an annual travel stipend, and a negotiated moving expense reimbursement. The new superintendent is expected to start employment on July 1, 2025.

The Board is committed to a selection process that is fair and open to all qualified candidates. Priority will be given to candidates whose experience and background closely match the desired characteristics. Candidates who do not possess an Alaska Type B certificate should begin the process to be considered for this position.

## **Bristol Bay Borough School District Profile**

Bristol Bay Borough is known as the "Red Salmon Capital of the World," as well as the "Gateway to Katmai National Park and Preserve." The borough functions as the official governing body for Naknek, South Naknek, and King Salmon and provides a variety of important services. The borough and school district offices are located in Naknek.

With a current enrollment of 98 students and a student-teacher ratio of 9:1, the Bristol Bay Borough School District operates three schools that provide a well-rounded educational experience for students from preschool through 12th grade: Naknek Elementary, Bristol Bay Middle/High School, and Bristol Bay Correspondence.

The Bristol Bay Borough School District was instrumental in forming the Bristol Bay Regional Career and Technical Education program that provides students in Bristol Bay Borough, Southwest Region, Dillingham, and Lake and Peninsula School Districts with career exploration opportunities. The district's board members, administrators, and staff are essential to improving opportunities and outcomes for students across the district. Regionally, visionary leadership and partnerships with the Bristol Bay Economic Development Corporation, Bristol Bay Native Corporation, Camai Community Health Center have had a profound impact on local education.

#### **Environment & Climate**

The Bristol Bay region provides a spectacular playground for adventurous fishers, hunters, hikers, and nature lovers. Naknek has a subarctic climate characterized by long, cold winters and short, cool summers. During the winter season, temperatures can reach lows of -30°F, and snowfall is frequent. Summers in Naknek are much milder, with temperatures reaching an average high of 65°F. Precipitation is higher during the summer months, resulting in over 200 days of frost-free weather. While temperatures can vary significantly throughout the year, the climate in Naknek is fairly temperate, with mild winters compared to other northern states.

### **Getting Here**

Alaska Airlines has non-stop flights from Anchorage to King Salmon four days a week in the winter and daily in the summer. Other regional airlines also serve the area year-round.
