The seven-member Board of Education of the Ketchikan Gateway Borough School District is searching for its next Superintendent.

The board seeks a candidate with strong fiscal and budget management skills, effective and culturally responsive communication skills, proven personnel leadership, and a talent for building positive community relationships.

The new Superintendent is expected to begin work on July 1, 2025.

A salary range of \$145,000 to \$175,000 with a multi-year contract is being offered to the successful candidate. An attractive benefits package is also offered, including life insurance, medical/health coverage, and a stipend for the use of a personal vehicle.

The Board of Education recognizes that selecting the Superintendent is one of the most important decisions it will make and is seeking a candidate that can help the Board meet its established mission and achieve quality education for all students in attendance.

The district's mission is, "Together, we foster an educational culture of academic excellence, meaningful connections, and nurturing environments to maximize every student's unique potential."

The Board is committed to a selection process that is fair and open to all qualified candidates. Candidates whose experience and background closely match the desired characteristics will be given priority.

Candidates who do not possess an Alaska Type B certificate with a Superintendent endorsement should begin the process to be considered for this position.

Ketchikan Gateway Borough School District Profile

Ketchikan, Alaska, is a coastal island community located in the heart of the Tongass National Forest in Southeast Alaska. Known for its deep Indigenous roots, vibrant arts scene, and rich fishing heritage, Ketchikan is often referred to as Alaska's "first city" due to its location at the southern tip of the Inside Passage. It is a popular stop for cruise ships and travelers exploring the region, but it's also home to a close-knit year-round community with a population of approximately 8,000 people.

Downtown Ketchikan is designated a National Historic District, with iconic boardwalks, picturesque landscapes, and totem poles lining the streets. The surrounding borough (Ketchikan Gateway Borough) encompasses suburbs both north and south of the city along the Tongass Highway, as well as small rural settlements accessible primarily by water.

Getting Here

Surrounded by rainforest and accessible only by air or sea, Ketchikan sits on Revillagigedo Island and serves as a regional hub for neighboring communities, including Prince of Wales Island, Metlakatla (the only Indian Reservation in Alaska), Wrangell, and the Alaska Native village of Saxman. Though remote, Ketchikan maintains strong transportation connections, with daily plane service to Juneau (45 minutes), Seattle (90 minutes) and Anchorage (3 hours), and ferry access via the Alaska Marine Highway System.

Climate

The climate is characterized by high rainfall—averaging nearly 160 inches annually—which sustains the lush temperate rainforest and supports a wide variety of wildlife. Locals often say the rain is what keeps everything so green and the fishing so good!

The Ketchikan Gateway Borough School District serves 2,104 students, Pre-K–12. The district includes five elementary schools (two of which are charter schools), one middle school, one high school, an alternative middle/high school, a district homeschool program, and a Tribal Scholars program run in partnership with the Ketchikan Indian Community. The district is an integral part of the community, with strong ties to local families, tribal organizations, and regional partners.
